We're currently finishing up our Playwriting unit, with students submitting their final scripts at the end of the week. For most, this is the FIRST time they've ever written something like this, so we learned a lot!

Our next unit will be Public Speaking. Students will be writing speeches and speech outlines, learning about finding your voice in your writing, and delivering selected speeches to the class.

Many students will have some level of uncomfortability with getting up in front of the class and speaking, but this unit is a great opportunity for them to gain confidence and work on skills related to presentation of self.

Speech topics will include Special Occasion, Demonstration, Persuasion, and Extemporaneous.

Literature Studies

We will be finishing our novels during the next two weeks. The student discussions surrounding the extraordinary lives of Malala Yousafzai and William Kamkwamba have been meaningful.

6th grade: Students will be taking a closer look at William's character by writing a paragraph citing textual evidence for their conclusions. We will watch William's TED talk and the inspiring movie in order to compare and contrast the approaches used to present similar themes and topics.

7th and 8th grade: Students will analyze speeches given by Malala that occurred after the time period covered in our novel. An *I AM* poem, similar to the one that students wrote last year about themselves, will be written from the point of view of one of the characters from the novel. Finally, a short answer test will be administered to cover plot development, characterization, and theme.

6th Grade Math: We are finishing our study of geometry by calculating surface area and volume of 3-D figures. Next we will explore probability and making predictions based on data trends.

Compacted 7th & 8th Grade Math: We just wrapped up our study of all things linear. Next we will look at angle relationships, transformations, surface areas, and volumes. This will require some memorization of formulas!

8th Grade - Math 1: We are wrapping up our study of exponential functions in the first week of March. Then we will dive into quadratic functions. In this unit we will study how quadratics shift, how to write functions, and how to solve using multiple methods.

6th Grade:

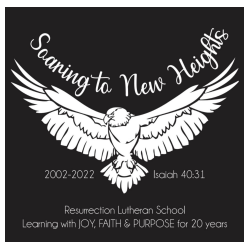

Students are collaborating with a classmate and taking the 2,000 mile journey from Missouri to either Oregon or California...wow what creativity they have!!! After this we will learn about Canada and its territories.

7th Grade:

We left South Asia with China, North and South Korea, and Japan. We have landed in Southeast Asia. The Mariana Trench is off the coast of the Philippines and Japan. deeper than the height of Mt Everest at approximate 36,000 feet, and home to the once prehistoric Megalodon that was 60' long!
