6th Grade Math:

We will finish this quarter by covering our unit on ratios, proportions, and percentages. In this unit we will work on writing ratios, rates, and unit rates. We will then use these rates to solve proportion and percent problems. The midterm for 6th grade math will be in mid-February.

Compacted 7th & 8th Grade Math:

We will begin the month by reviewing the material covered in units 1-6 as we prepare for the midterm exam. The midterm will be on Monday, January 8th and Tuesday, January 9th. This will count a regular test grade. A lot of review material has been posted in google classroom.

8th Grade - Math 1:

This month we will be wrapping up our study of linear functions. First we will finish our unit on writing and solving linear functions, then we will move into our study of systems of linear equations.
