#### **STEM NEWS**

What is NCTies?

NCTIES is a membership association for educators and educator leaders engaged in advancing excellence in learning and teaching through the effective use of technology.

Mrs. Lee, 6th grade Science Teacher, was SUPER excited to announce that our two proposals for NC Ties were accepted for the sixth grade science class. Last year, only a few students that applied were able to participate and they all had a blast. This year she wanted ALL sixth graders to be able to experience the conference and gave it a shot when she applied. She was thrilled when we got in and assigned two teams - one team of eight and one team of nine.

On March 7, 2024 students along with a group of RLS teachers headed for the NC Convention center. where they would spend the next two days learning, presenting and discovering new technologies to enhance the educational environment.

Project Goal for team one: Students will design a floor model of a NASA launch station. They will use OzoBots and code a release from "storage" to their rocket. This OzoBot will reach a mechanism (just in time!) that will launch a slingshot rocket. The goal is to reach the rocket within 10 seconds from storage exit. The students will explain each step of their creation including the design process, materials, how they collaborated and the technology they used throughout the project.

Project Goal for team two: After Artemis' Orion rocket launched and orbited for 25 ½ days, NASA had to retrieve the Artemis Capsule to analyze the data collected. Students will simulate a gentle landing of the capsule (parachutes and capsule built by students) in the "ocean" in order to keep the capsule intact. Then, students will use Sphero Mini's to code and bring the capsule home on a path to NASA headquarters (model of this built by students).

Mrs. Farmer, Mrs. Lee, Mrs. Hancock, Mrs. King, Mrs. Reynik, Mrs. Barnette and Mrs. Hester all attended the conference and brought back many ideas that they have already begun to implement new technology in their classrooms. RLS teachers are the BEST!




